# **Moodboarding and Colour Scheme**

# **Moodboarding**

I want this portfolio page to be cohesive in its design, and also for the colour scheme to have some longevity. That means not using and trendy palettes or overly glitzy/gradiented/energetic colours, and usign a simple and reflexive design. #### Colour Scheme

For this I would use a Monochrome or Analogous theme with bold colours only being used for emphasis and animations.

Will stick to blues, purples and deep reds and reconsider as I go. Would like to use a gradient background for the main section from a slightly saturated blue to a desaturated grey blue. Colours as below:

- Font Colours
  - Light to contrast dark background colours, dark to contrast light backgrounds


• All sticking to theme colour pallette

- Header
  - Darkest shade of chosen colour palette
  - Nav buttons to be light tint of chosen theme colour w/ dark shadow to pop
- Main
  - o Background: Muted version of theme colour, gradient to grey in bottom right corner
  - Cards: Darker shade of chosen colour w neon glow border
- Footer
  - same colour as header to create clean and cohesive look

### **Colour Palette Options**

### **Option 1**

The first colour scheme option is for a monochrome palette of muted blues. I really enjoy this colour scheme as blues tend to evoke calmness and reliability, and greys stability and strength of character. The addition of the darkest blue also is close to black which is mystery and sophistication.

# Option 2

The second colour scheme is a little more diverse, with a few extra colours to add some highlighting and details. Since a portfolio is so important to your ongoing success and hirability as a developer, I would like to use this if not initially but in future to really bring particular focus to certain elements and aspects of the page.

# **Pages and Sections**

Nav bar reflects the priority of other pages on the site, with projects, work history and finally contact as the heirarchy. The footer is present on all pages and has direct contact details as well as links to social media and git.

Header is simple clean design static formatting for all subpages:

- Logo/Profile Picture top left image
- Nav bar
  - 4x clickable anchor link buttons
    - Home
    - Projects

- Work History
- Contact
- Name & Github Handle Logo top right above nav buttons

#### Footer contains:

- Copyright information
- Social media clickable links (circular icon style)
- direct contact info (email mailto link for desktop, email address for mobile and tablet users)

### Home page (index.html)

#### Main

Landing page with "about me" section, including basic personal information, hobbies and interests, as well as what programming/design languages I have experience with. Will use static elements and containers including large profile image.

- Animations
  - fade in for "about" section
  - Grayscale colour fade in for photo
  - rotation animation for large photo

# **Projects**

#### Main

Flexbox and Card divs for projects with the following in each:

- Image Thumb code snippet for each project
- Project Title Title
- List of skills/languages used Alongside the card container will be a "Project Details" section with further detail for each project. Link to all repos on GitHub directly through clickable image thumb, as well as upcoming assessments in the DEV1001/1002 modules. Card will also be clickable to link to the correct detail section.

Ideally use shadow and/or neon effect to add emphasis to each, with hover psuedoclass. Ideas for unique hover animations:

- Neon colour effect on hover
- Grayscale all other cards on hover?
  - This one would be a challenge as we haven't really covered this on any lessons, would look cool though to emphasise the one card!
- Scale increase on hover to add emphasis and make text more readable?

Formatting similar to above, with additional details below:

- Scale animation on hover
- Other job experience including ZV & skills, Brooksfield & skills.
- Excel file snippets (macros and logic strings)
- Link to file on html page Resume.PDF
- Any external links to websites as needed through thumbnail for each job

Max Screen width 600

- No hover animations for any sections
  - Animation for each thumbnail to imply that links are clickable
- adjust font size using most appropriate industry standard responsive formatting
- display all content in one scrollable section
- adjusted element size with dvw

# **Tablet Device**

max screen width 820

- No hover animations for any sections
  - Animation for each thumbnail to imply that links are clickable
- re-display card content as dual scrollable columns
- adjusted element size with dvw
- adjust font size using most appropriate industry standard responsive formatting






